

Arctic Incentive Adventure

Day 1

Afternoon arrival of group, approximately 15:00. Meet and greet at airport by english speaking guide and board awaiting coach or limosines.

Transfer from airport to hotel Reykjavik with a duration of around 45 minutes.

Group pre-checked in so keys are ready and delivered in lobby upon arrival. Welcome drink at hotel before guests go to their rooms.



Dinner planned in the evening at the trendy gourmet restaurant at Siggí Hall's Iceland's famous tv chef. This restaurant was voted one of top 100 best new restaurants in the world by Condé Nastl Traveler. Specialities include wild lamb, baccalao (salted cod), lobster and seafood.

Day 2

Buffet breakfast in hotel.

Departure for our super jeep adventure of a lifetime. Our "**super jeeps**" are specially equipped 4x4 vehicles, Nissans, Toyotas, Fords, etc., that have been fitted with extra large and wide tires, 44 inches is the norm. These tires give us



the possibility to travel in heavy snow and on glaciers. If we encounter large snowdrifts, then tires are deflated, often down to around 1 pound per square inch, thus offering better traction and floatation over the snow and not through it. These 4x4's are also fitted with navigational equipment like GPS - Global Positioning System - which receives its signals from satellites overhead. This allows us to drive

all over the interior of the country in zero visibility as most routes have already been plotted out and these navigational computers are so accurate that you can position your vehicle to an accuracy of a few feet.

Suddenly a helicopter appears out of nowhere and offers the jeep riders a flight across the scenic landscape. All will have a chance to ride the helicopter to the area where the snowmobiles are positioned.

In the month of May driving time to the snowline should be around 2 - 2 ½ hours through beautiful scenery, (it is also possible that it will be enough snow in the mountains just 30 min to 1 hrs drive from Reykjavik) during which we will explain all the driving techniques of the 4x4's to the guests and allow them to see how Icelanders use their jeeps. Once in enough snow we will put up a snowmobile route for the the guests where they will really be able to blow off some steam in rallying up hills and down again, around circle 8 tracks etc.

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Pending condition, glacier events will include some or all of the following plus a few more pending conditions:

Snowmobiling - after a short orientation of these exciting machines, you blast away for an hour of suspense and excitement! High adrenalin, high action snowmobiles and on a good day the most spectacular views never to be forgotten!

Tobogganing - what more can we say - lots of fun - especially on top of a glacier.

Inner tube down hill racing – more fun! Inner tubes from giant tyres!

Glacier golf - orange golfballs, endless “greens”, a hole in the middle of nowhere. For the golfer that’s been everywhere.

Overalls will be provided as well as goggles and helmets, which are mandatory on the snowmobiles.

Of course food and drinks will be brought along for where tables and seats are carved out of the hillside serving shrimp, halibut, salmon, patés, hot soup, breads, cheeses, etc. Possible to arrange a BBQ as well. Wine and beer chilled in the ice. Black clad waiters can be provided at a supplement. Return back to hotel at around 17:30.



Rest and relax until dinner which is planned at another trendy restaurant, **Apotek** restaurant, formerly a pharmacy but changed into a restaurant a couple of years ago. Excellent food, fantastic service and located close to everything. Nightlife par excellence within a stone’s throw of the restaurant.

Day 3

Buffet breakfast at hotel until 10:00.

Morning at leisure and approx. at 10:30 transfer towards the airport. En route a



stop at the Svartsengi thermal area, 45 minutes, where the local authorities have

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harnessed an intensely hot thermal area, with natural steam at temperatures of over 230°C. This steam is used to heat fresh water which in turn is piped to



neighbouring towns and villages for heating of homes and businesses. Totally pollution free energy which will last forever. A by-product of this powerfield is a geothermal lake, over 8000 m² large, which is formed by condensation of this natural steam. The lake, nicknamed the Blue lagoon is at around body temperature and extremely popular as a swimming hole for locals and foreigners alike. The scene is extremely surrealistic and unworldly as the newly opened bathhouse and

restaurant facility is landscaped into the black surrounding lava. Large private changing rooms for either gender and a huge restaurant make this an ideal place for a very "warm" welcome. We can provide a wide variety of entertainment on the banks of the lake, while the guests are served a special Blue lagoon cocktail in the water, served by black dressed servants or models in swim suits. Delegates can really enjoy the lagoon's relaxing and soothing waters.

Lunch after relaxing in the lagoon in the excellent restaurant overlooking the lagoon before heading back to Reykjavik.

Possibility to do horse riding tour in beautiful landscape in the vicinity of Reykjavik on the way back; 1 hour riding in the lava fields around Mt. Helgafell and the vegetated Kaldarsel. Rest of day to relax , shopping etc.

Perlan

The Perlan restaurant is Reykjavik's latest landmark. Towering over the city from one of its highest hills, the Perlan sits atop the geothermal reservoir tanks overlooking the city. The top floor restaurant is enclosed in a glass dome and the floor rotates 360° every 90 - 120 minutes. Possible to offer entertainment, dinner music and even dancing. Seats over 300 people on round tables. Excellent for Gala dinner.



Day 4:

Early morning simple breakfast before boarding coach for transfer to Keflavik airport for return flight. Departure from hotel 2 hours before departure of flight.
